

## REGISTER FOR PGA

Our Placement for Graduate Assistants events are open to any potential graduate student who is considering graduate studies at Auburn University and has a desire to work in a student-centered environment. During the application process, candidates may request interviews based on their interest in a specific office and position. Interviews are then offered at the discretion of each office.

- February 1st: HIED application due
- February 19th: Applicants notified of offered interviews
- February 23rd: Applicants accept interviews and confirm PGA attendance
- February 28th: Applicants receive interview schedule
- March 5th: PGA on-campus interviews
- March 7th: Employers begin offering positions to applicants

## NAVIGATING THE ASSISTANTSHIP PROCESS

## BASIC TIPS

- Choose a supervisor you can see yourself working with over the next two years
- Make sure to ask plenty of questions of your own during the interview process
- Pick an office that seems to be the right fit for you (mission, co-workers, etc.)
- Use specific experiences and events to illustrate your skills and abilities
- Come prepared with around three questions to ask the panel at the end of your interview
- Bring thank you notes to send to employers after your interviews

## TIPS FROM CURRENT GRADS

- Broaden your horizons. Interview for positions outside of your comfort zone. Choose something that will both challenge and excite you
- Bring your business cards, resumes and references with you. Most employers will have this information on hand but it shows you are prepared.
- Act as though you are being interviewed for the extent for PGA. Don't show up to breakfast in sweats just because your interview isn't until 2.
- "Tell me about yourself" should be answered in relation to the position. Refrain from talking about your childhood, hobbies, favorite foods, etc.
- Take time to formulate an answer in your mind before responding
- Answer "tell me about a time when..." questions using the STAR method. Situation, task, action, result.
- Dress to impress-blacks, greys and navys are always safe colors
- Meet a new friend at PGA- exchange business cards


- Business cards (if you already have them)

## FINANCING YOUR GRAD School

We've pulled together some of the key information below about holding an assistantship and financing your education at Auburn for your reference. Any further questions you might have can be answered directly by the Graduate School.

- All GA's must pass a background check
- All GA's must complete an I-9 form by the third day of work
- The Student Services fee is waived as long as you are registered and on assistantship; HOWEVER, there will be a \$563 Enrollment Fee
- In and out-of-state tuition is waived if you are a GA and your FTE (working rate) is above .32 (most will be closer to .50)
- GA's on academic probation will be charged in-state tuition for that semester
- Distance courses are not covered by the tuition waiver
- All GA's are automatically enrolled in the Student Health insurance and can opt out if they so choose
  - If you do not opt out, you will receive a \$450 waiver for both the fall and spring semesters to offset the cost


